Dear Friends in Christ,

I pray this finds you well and resting in the grace, mercy, and peace of God for us, in Jesus Christ. During this most unprecedented season, following the arrival of COVID-19, we have experienced a number of changes to the ways we have approached community life in the past. Changes to Worship, congregational life in general, family schedules, employment, school, grocery shopping, and social activities are only a handful of examples from a much longer list. And yet, amidst the changes we have continued to rejoice with you in the long-standing, ever-enduring promise(s) of God:

He remains for us (Romans 8:31); He has not left us nor forsaken us (Hebrews 13:5); He has not withdrawn His love from us (Romans 8:38-39); and He remains faithful to His plan to work for the good even now (Romans 8:28). In light of this, then, we now hear our Lord's words all the more clearly: "Do not let your hearts be troubled." (John 14:1)

These past several weeks the leadership of Praise Lutheran Church and I have kept you in our prayers while closely monitoring the present situation as it has continued to unfold. At this point in time and upon the heels of recent leadership discussions we are prepared to take the following steps towards gathering for Worship, celebrating Holy Communion, and participating in the daily life of the Church.

Phases of Reopening and Accompanying Action Steps Church

for Praise Lutheran

Phase 1 (Present-June 14)

During Phase 1 leaders and volunteers will continue working to: secure personal protection equipment for parishioners and guests, clean our worship environment prior to onsite gatherings, modify our seating arrangement and layout to allow for social distancing while worshipping and communing, provide training for Worship volunteers, and address audio-video needs for the continuation of livestream Worship services to our parishioners and community.

Please note too the following considerations for Phase 1:

- Worship Services will be offered <u>online only</u> through our Praise Lutheran Facebook page and website (as well as other avenues currently being explored) during Phase 1.
- Gatherings or Meetings will only take place online only or via phone call.
- Church Staff will continue working remotely and will remain available for meetings, counseling, prayer, spiritual care, etc.
- Personal Protection Equipment will include the following: disposable masks, disposable gloves, disinfecting wipes, and hand sanitizer.
- Seating will be set up to accommodate 6ft spacing for rows and seat clusters (for family units and individuals alike).
- o Communication will continue to parishioners and community members alike as to expectations, addressing concerns, updated timeframes, and accompanying steps.

Phase 2 (June 21-July 26)

During Phase 2 Praise will take initial steps with onsite Worship Services. In an attempt to both reduce the size of our gatherings (at this point in time) and allow for visitors Praise will use the following approach:

Onsite Worship

- Online access to Worship will continue through the avenues noted above.
- Onsite Worship for households with last names beginning with <u>A-M</u> will be held on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month.
- Onsite Worship for households with last names beginning with <u>N-Z</u> will be held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.
- The 5th Sunday of the month (as applicable) will be used for <u>online Worship only</u> (i.e. there will be no onsite gathering on the 5th Sunday of the month).
 <u>Please note too the following considerations for Phase 2</u> that take into account Governor Eric Holcomb's plan "Back on Track Indiana":
- No Bulletins or Handouts of any kind will be used.
- o A minimal number of Leaders and Volunteers will be used during Worship Services.
- <u>Doors will open at 10:00am</u> to allow for reduced use of facility space prior to Worship as well as direction to seating prior to Worship.
- Folks will be ushered in from the Welcome Area/Narthex and towards Sanctuary seating prior to Worship.
- o There will be no Meetings/Classes offered before or after Worship at this time.
- Conversations are encouraged outside before/after Worship and while observing social distancing guidelines offered by Community Health Leaders.
- At this time, there will be no organized Fellowship/Coffee/Food Gatherings before or after Worship
 to limit space use and ensure the cleanliness of the area for our Little Praisers ministry partners to
 begin their week.
- The Collection of our Tithes and Offerings will continue online as well as through designated areas near the Sanctuary's double doors on the way in/way out.
- No Sharing of the Peace, hand-shakes, hugs, elbow bumps, or physical contact of any kind will be observed at this point in time.
- At the conclusion of Worship dismissal from the Sanctuary will be directed by our ushers.
- <u>Facemasks will be required</u> inside facilities and during Worship at this point in time for leaders, volunteers, and worshippers alike. You are encouraged to bring a facemask to Worship while Church Staff secure such to be provided at a later time.
- <u>Facemasks will be</u> required inside facilities for those leading worship, those assisting during
 Worship (as with Distribution of Holy Communion, ushering, audio/video support), those preparing
 for Worship (Holy Communion preparation, Altar/Chancel arrangements, etc.), Counting
 ministries, and those assisting with post Worship cleaning.
- Disposable gloves and Hand Sanitizer will be made available in the Sanctuary and immediately upon entering/leaving the building.
- Per the recommendations of Community Health Leaders we ask that the following folks strongly consider staying at home and making use of our online Worship services:
 - Those who are 65 years of age and older,
 - Those with health risks and compromised health,

- Those who have been sick, have come in contact with someone presenting symptoms, and those presenting symptoms themselves.
- Congregational Singing will be reduced at this point in time to allow for a limited amount of time in our Sanctuary and shared space.

Holy Communion

During the last several weeks we have not celebrated Holy Communion. This was not an easy decision. Several scenarios were entertained but did not produce options that would ensure your safety and well-being during Distribution. During Phase 2 we look forward to once again celebrating this means of grace for us in the following fashion that coincides with the onsite Worship gatherings encouraged above:

- The 1st Sunday of the month will be used to Commune Household Groups A-M (Sunday June 21 will be the first available Communion Sunday for Household Groups A-M. Sunday July 5 will be the next Communion opportunity to follow).
- The 2nd Sunday of the month will be used to Commune Household Groups N-Z (<u>Sunday June 28</u> will be the first available Communion Sunday for Household Groups N-Z. <u>Sunday July 12</u> will be the next Communion opportunity to follow).
- Communion Flow and Distribution will be modified to both allow for individual/family units to commune and to ensure social distancing and reduced standing/waiting time.
- Volunteers assisting with Distribution will be required to wear masks and gloves.
- Meditative music will be used during Distribution to reduce congregational singing.

• Phase 3 (August 2-September 6)

During Phase 3 Praise Lutheran will continue with the considerations laid out in Phase 2 and will reevaluate the opportunity for all households to once again: gather for onsite Worship, participate in Sunday morning Christian Education for all ages, reengage auxiliary ministries, and attend onsite meetings. Leadership will continue to monitor the changes within our community and will provide timely communication to our congregation and community as to changes that may need to occur.

In close, please know that the previously outlined steps and thoughts have been prayerfully identified with your well-being mind. We understand that no plan will offer a "one size fits all" solution and that upon reading this plan some may still seek to self-quarantine and/or social distance until a later time. That decision is okay, and we support you in Christian love while looking forward to the time when we can once again come together.

Moving forward we invite everyone to continue making use of our online Worship services, the Church Staff's/Leadership's availability via phone/email, the Congregational Needs Survey, the Reopening Considerations Survey, and our ministry partners¹ so that we may continue our service of Christlike compassion and care to you and those in need.

Through His Holy Spirit and Word, God enables us to stand firm no matter the season. To that end, may you remain steadfast, immovable, and abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor in the Lord is never in vain (1 Corinthians 15:58).

Praise AV, music, and technology update - From Josh Gumbert.

Greetings from the other side of the screen! It has been an uphill battle, but we are steadily rising to the challenge that the pandemic has brought us. Although challenging, we have found an amazing opportunity to reach a larger part of our community through live streaming.

At the beginning of the year, we had our new AV equipment successfully installed. This included a new computer, soundboard, new projectors, acoustic sound proofing, and a couple other smaller items. Because we were able to make this \$20,000 AV upgrade happen, we set ourselves up for success during these trying times. However, there is now a few more items we need to improve the quality of our broadcast. Luckily, we have been blessed by a couple of anonymous donors, and we will be able to make these improvements soon. We are currently applying for a new technology grant as well, which will help with these unexpected costs. The grant is through the center for congregations. We should know within the month of June whether we are awarded the grant. With this money, we will be purchasing necessary licensing and software subscriptions, as well as a new camera, video mixer, and a few other pieces of video gear.

The AV department is becoming an evermore critical ministry for Praise, as the need for an online and digital presence increases exponentially. As we experience these growing pains, we will very quickly need more volunteers to continue with our growth. We recently added a new team member to the AV department, Nick Longworth. He has already begun training with us and we are very excited to have him on board!


