We at Praise would like to get to know you! In celebrating Holy Communion, Lutherans believe that when we receive the bread and wine in the Lord's Supper (also known as Holy Communion, The Sacrament of the Altar, and/or Eucharist) they also receive the true body and blood of Jesus Christ (Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; and 1 Corinthians 11:23-25). If you: share this belief with us, are an adult or one who has received instruction on the Lord's Supper, are a baptized Christian seeking to confess your sins to God, believing that Jesus Christ is your Savior, and desiring to live a new life in Jesus Christ, you are welcome to join us as we celebrate this means of God's grace. We kindly ask that those who have not received education on the Lord's Supper, both adults and children, take a moment to visit with Pastor Seth prior to learn more about this special gift of the Lord's Supper. Those who are not receiving the Sacrament are still warmly invited to come forward at that time for a prayer and/or blessing at the altar; we kindly ask that you let Pastor Seth and the Assistant(s) know you do not intend to receive Communion by crossing your arms across your chest as you come forward. The colored glasses in the center of the tray (held by a Communion Assistant) contain a non-alcoholic wine intended for those who, for personal or medical reasons, are unable to use regular wine. Gluten-free wafers are also available for those with dietary/health considerations.

CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

P: Dear Friends in Christ, this morning we come together to celebrate God’s power and victory in our lives. As the crowds proclaimed on that first Palm Sunday, we exclaim as well:

C: Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! (John 12:13)

P: As we enter this Holy Week, we recognize that while many people witnessed Jesus’ life and ministry, they completely missed seeing Him for Who He truly is. God’s Word shows us:

C: Even after Jesus ministered among the people with great signs and acts of authority, they still would not believe in Him. (John 12:37)

P: Are we so different? How often have we heard God’s Word, yet resisted its place in our lives? How often have we beheld God’s awesome works in our lives, and yet walked away unchanged and unimpressed? With this in mind, let us take a moment to go before our Heavenly Father, confessing our sins and once again seeking grace to see through eyes of faith the gifts of grace, mercy, forgiveness, and victory extended to us, through the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

(Silence for reflection upon God’s Word and self-examination)

P: Almighty God, Heavenly Father,

C: As we prepare to enter this Holy Week, and witness the sacrifice Jesus made for us, we confess, we have oftentimes lived with closed-off hearts and minds to Your will for us. We have chosen to view discipleship through the lens of personal preference and circumstance, as opposed to complete surrender to You. As a result, we have not demonstrated the type of faithful commitment You expect of us all.

P: Almighty God, Heavenly Father,

C: During this Holy Week, we cling to Jesus' sacrifice for us. So we ask, for the sake of Jesus' death on the cross, be merciful to us, and forgive us of all our sins against You and our neighbors. Through Your Holy Spirit, overcome the hard and rigid places of our faith, and bring Gospel growth to Your glory.

P: Upon this, your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of God's Word, announce the grace of God unto you all, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you, all of your sins, in the Name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit!

C: Amen!

FIRST READING

(Zechariah 9:9-12)

⁹ Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. ¹⁰ I will take away the chariots from Ephraim and the warhorses from Jerusalem, and the battle bow will be broken. He will proclaim peace to the nations. His rule will extend from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth. ¹¹ As for you, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will free your prisoners from the waterless pit. ¹² Return to your fortress, you

prisoners of hope; even now I announce that I will restore twice as much to you.

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE READING

(Philippians 2:5-11)

⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: ⁶ Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; ⁷ rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross! ⁹ Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING

(John 12:20-43)

²⁰ Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the festival. ²¹ They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. “Sir,” they said, “we would like to see Jesus.” ²² Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus.

²³ Jesus replied, “The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. ²⁵ Anyone who loves their life will lose it, while anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me.

²⁷ “Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? ‘Father, save me from this hour’? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name!”

Then a voice came from heaven, “I have glorified it, and will glorify it again.” ²⁹ The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him.

³⁰ Jesus said, “This voice was for your benefit, not mine. ³¹ Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.” ³³ He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.

³⁴ The crowd spoke up, “We have heard from the Law that the Messiah will remain forever, so how can you say, ‘The Son of Man must be lifted up’? Who is this ‘Son of Man’?”

³⁵ Then Jesus told them, “You are going to have the light just a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, before darkness overtakes you. Whoever walks in the dark does not know where they are going. ³⁶ Believe in the light while you have the light, so that you may become children of light.” When he had finished speaking, Jesus left and hid himself from them.

³⁷ Even after Jesus had performed so many signs in their presence, they still would not believe in him. ³⁸ This was to fulfill the word of Isaiah the prophet:

“Lord, who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?” ³⁹ For this reason they could not believe, because, as Isaiah says elsewhere: ⁴⁰ “He has blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts, so they can neither see with their eyes, nor understand with their hearts, nor turn—and I would heal them.” ⁴¹ Isaiah said this because he saw Jesus’ glory and spoke about him.

⁴² Yet at the same time many even among the leaders believed in him. But because of the Pharisees they would not openly acknowledge their faith for fear they would be put out

of the synagogue; ⁴³ for they loved human praise more than praise from God.

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

SERMON TITLE
“Eyes on Jesus: The King in our Midst”

THE STATEMENT OF FAITH: ***“Nicene Creed”***

C: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. Giving of Our Tithes and Offerings to The Lord

During this season, you are invited to join us as we continue to give thanks to God with our Tithes and Offerings.

SERMON REFLECTIONS/NOTES:

In John 12:37, we hear the following: “Even after Jesus had done all these miraculous signs in their presence, they still would not believe in Him.” Does this strike you as odd? Why or why not?

Today, Jesus is still seeking to be the Savior and Lord of our life, and yet oftentimes He is met with hard resistance from us. While we celebrate His presence during some moments, we close off His access to other areas. Where have you been experiencing this as of late? And what is making it difficult to surrender (trust, a need for control, past woundedness, etc.?)
