We kindly ask that those who have not received education on the Lord's Supper, both adults and children, take a moment to visit with Pastor Seth prior to learn more about this special gift of the Lord's Supper. Those who are not receiving the Sacrament are still warmly invited to come forward at that time for a prayer and/or blessing at the altar; we kindly ask that you let Pastor Seth and the Assistant(s) know you do not intend to receive Communion by crossing your arms across your chest as you come forward. The colored glasses in the center of the tray (held by a Communion Assistant) contain a non-alcoholic wine intended for those who, for personal or medical reasons, are unable to use regular wine. Gluten-free wafers are also available for those with dietary/health considerations.*

## **CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION**

P: Dear Friends in Christ, this morning as we continue with our sermon series, *Christ, Community, and Culture* we will witness how the Holy Spirit moves powerfully through The Church to communicate the life, power, and hope of The Risen Christ! As we will see, God gives us opportunities as well to share the hope of Jesus with our community in ways that reflect our personal relationship with Him.

God's Word tells us: "In your hearts revere Christ as Lord."

**C: "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." (1 Peter 3:15)**

P: As we think back to recent activities, situations, and conversations, each of us can probably place a finger on missed opportunities to share God's love, forgiveness, and hope with the people in our lives—whether in word or deed. We can also recall moments where we have not revered Christ as Lord of all.

With that said, let us take this opportunity to approach our Heavenly Father's throne of grace, confessing our sins and seeking The Holy Spirit's aid in living a faithful Gospel witness.

***(Silence for reflection on God's Word and personal confession)***

P: Almighty God, Heavenly Father,

**C: As we come to worship You this morning, we recognize that our week has been filled with missed opportunities for sharing the hope we have in Jesus. We**

**have looked too often to our own wisdom and strength to assist us in times of need, and we have not revered Jesus as Lord. As a result, we have sinned against You and those around us.**

P: Almighty God, Heavenly Father,

**C: For the sake of Jesus' innocent suffering and death, have mercy upon us. Forgive us of our failures. Remove the guilt of our sin. Fill us with Your Holy Spirit, and equip us with what is needed to gladly share the hope we have through Jesus Christ.**

P: Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of God's Word, announce the grace of God unto you all, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you, all of your sins, in the Name of the Father and of the (+) Son and of the Holy Spirit!

**C: Amen!**

**FIRST READING**

**(Acts 4:1-20)**

<sup>1</sup>The priests and the captain of the temple guard and the Sadducees came up to Peter and John while they were speaking to the people. <sup>2</sup>They were greatly disturbed because the apostles were teaching the people, proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead. <sup>3</sup>They seized Peter and John and, because it was evening, they put them in jail until the next day. <sup>4</sup>But many who heard the message believed; so the number of men who believed grew to about five thousand.

<sup>5</sup>The next day the rulers, the elders and the teachers of the law met in Jerusalem. <sup>6</sup>Annas the high priest was there, and so were Caiaphas, John, Alexander and others of the high priest's family. <sup>7</sup>They had Peter and John brought before them and began to question them: "By what power or what name did you do this?"

<sup>8</sup> Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them: “Rulers and elders of the people! <sup>9</sup> If we are being called to account today for an act of kindness shown to a man who was lame and are being asked how he was healed, <sup>10</sup> then know this, you and all the people of Israel: It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead, that this man stands before you healed. <sup>11</sup> Jesus is “the stone you builders rejected, which has become the cornerstone.”

<sup>12</sup> Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved.”

<sup>13</sup> When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus. <sup>14</sup> But since they could see the man who had been healed standing there with them, there was nothing they could say. <sup>15</sup> So they ordered them to withdraw from the Sanhedrin and then conferred together. <sup>16</sup> “What are we going to do with these men?” they asked. “Everyone living in Jerusalem knows they have performed a notable sign, and we cannot deny it. <sup>17</sup> But to stop this thing from spreading any further among the people, we must warn them to speak no longer to anyone in this name.”

<sup>18</sup> Then they called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. <sup>19</sup> But Peter and John replied, “Which is right in God’s eyes: to listen to you, or to him? You be the judges! <sup>20</sup> As for us, we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard.”

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

**C: Thanks be to God.**

### **EPISTLE READING**

**(1 John 3:16-24)**

<sup>16</sup> This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. <sup>17</sup> If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on

them, how can the love of God be in that person? <sup>18</sup> Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.

<sup>19</sup> This is how we know that we belong to the truth and how we set our hearts at rest in his presence: <sup>20</sup> If our hearts condemn us, we know that God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. <sup>21</sup> Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence before God <sup>22</sup> and receive from him anything we ask, because we keep his commands and do what pleases him. <sup>23</sup> And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us. <sup>24</sup> The one who keeps God's commands lives in him, and he in them. And this is how we know that he lives in us: We know it by the Spirit he gave us.

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

**C: Thanks be to God.**

**(John 10:11-18)**

<sup>11</sup> "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. <sup>12</sup> The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. <sup>13</sup> The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

<sup>14</sup> "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me— <sup>15</sup> just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup> I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. <sup>17</sup> The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life—only to take it up again. <sup>18</sup> No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."

**THE STATEMENT OF FAITH:** ***“Nicene Creed”***

Upon receiving the blood of Christ, you are encouraged to place your individual cup in the trash receptacle as you return to your seat along the respective side aisle.

If you are in need of assistance or unable to come forward, please let Pastor Seth or an Assistant know.

\*Volunteers have been asked to wear masks and gloves while preparing and setting up Holy Communion.

## WORDS OF CONSECRATION

*(Matthew 26:26-28, Mark 14:22-24, Luke 22:19-20, 1 Corinthians 11:23-25)*

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My (†) body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My (†) blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
